GRACE HAS A SOCIAL WORKER

Did you know there is a social worker at Grace? Her name is Lisa Guagenti – the students call her Mrs. G. She is employed by Lutheran Child and Family Services of Illinois to provide six hours of social work services per week to Grace School. Mrs. G's credentials include a Master's in Social Work (MSW), a License in Clinical Social Work (LCSW) and a Type 73 School Social Work certificate. Mrs. G. has worked at Grace for 15 years, typically on Tuesdays and Fridays from 10am-1pm. Services provided vary depending on need and include crisis intervention, teacher and parent consultation, Erin's Law education (sexual abuse prevention) and individual counseling for students struggling with an issue that is interfering with their academic success. CLASSROOM CHATTER

PK: PK has been learning about Autumn changes. We took nature walks for a scavenger hunt and collections for the discovery table (see picture). We even found a spider! And observed the way it moves in a bug box. All items were returned to the earth.

SK: Ms. Johnson's Senior Kindergarten superstars painted pumpkins and created their own patch outside of the classroom with their fantastic fourth grade chapel buddies.

- 2nd: 2nd graders have created and presented Cereal Box Book Reports. They read a book of choice and imaginatively summarized their book, created artwork and a game, and shared it with their classmates all on a creatively decorated former box of cereal!
- 3rd: Ms. Watson's third grade students are collecting cans to help Grace Church with their canned food drive. Any and all donations of canned items are appreciated. Come worship with them at the 3rd grade-led chapel service on Wednesday, November 6th.
- 4th: The fourth graders have been studying animal classification and took a field trip to the Shedd Aquarium where they got to dissect squid. They've enjoyed learning about the design process and they had the special privilege to hear from Jeff Blackman and his design work at NASA. They look forward to having several parents come in for our Hispanic Heritage festival (rescheduled to 11/15). The fourth graders LOVE spending time with their SK chapel buddies and have spent time reading to them and painting pumpkins together.
- 5th: Mrs. Massmann's fifth graders joined their sixth grades friends to learn more about Chicago's history on a field trip to the DuSable Museum. We are grateful that our visiting art lecturer, Rhea Sprecher, was able to give the students background knowledge before the experience. The students then toured the museum which is focused on the artwork of Margaret Burroughs and the legacy of Harold Washington, their background knowledge impressed many of the museum staff members. It was a great morning for all and a true hidden gem for most of the students. It is such a blessing to be able to learn outside of the classroom, they are excited to explore the Field Museum next month. Fifth grade has also started a ten-week program led by RFPD Officer Ransom called "Too Good for Drugs."
- **6**th: In addition to visiting the DuSable Museum last month, sixth grade is studying the country of Egypt and will be heading to the Field Museum with the fifth graders in early November to visit the Egyptian section along with the other exhibits.

7th/8th: Our seventh and eighth grade students enjoyed September in Springfield. Our junior high students traveled to our capital to learn about the history of our great state.

Art: The art studio is bustling as always. This month our second graders will begin a unit on batik and our fourth-grade class will be learning the ancient Japanese art of fish painting known as Gyotaku. Supplies are always needed to help foster our young artists, especially 32-ounce plastic jars.

P.E.: Mrs. Underhill leads P.E. for 1st-8th grades multiple times a week. Grace realizes that physical exertion leads to a more focused mind for studies and thus we thank Mrs. Underhill for all that she does for our students. The 5-8th graders are still working on learning how to use their P.E. lockers and open/close a combination lock. If your student needs extra practice, please let Mrs. Underhill know as she will set up a time to practice with them. Also, "loaner" uniforms will be disappearing as students are learning to depend on these too much and not owning the responsibility of being on time and prepared by bringing their own uniforms to P.E. class. 5-8th P.E. highlights this fall include: learning skills in volleyball, football, and Spikeball. Basketball and racket sports are coming soon. Workout days have been heart racing with Concordia bleacher running, circuit workouts, and Tabata waves. Coming soon will be workouts running stairs and using the bikes. All levels of students are working on jump rope skills and alternating jumping into the rope as a class. Younger students have enjoyed secret agent tag, throwing skills, and color relays.

FALL SPORTS FOLLOW-UP: Our Grace Vikings had another fantastic fall season on the court and on the course.

Volleyball- Grace's 2019 volleyball season ended on October 29. The Varsity Girls won the Trinity Burr Ridge Tournament and improved greatly individually and as a team. The Varsity Boys represented a young, improving team (all boys 5-8th grades), led by returning players, Peter Armstrong and Layne Hammer, both eighth graders. The JV Girls and the fifth and sixth grade boys concluded the season with a JV Tournament in Arlington Heights, playing five consecutive games. Grace athletes modeled the school's values and supported one another across age and gender. Be on the lookout for open gyms and other volleyball playing opportunities throughout the school year.

Cross Country- Congratulations to all 40+ runners on their sensational season. Every runner (from third through eighth grade) ran their hearts out at practice and meets. They not only learned to love the sport but also learned the importance of perseverance and pushing themselves to be their best each and every time. The season concluded on Saturday, October 26 at the National Meet in Mequon, WI, where ten girls (who took fifth in state) and ten boys (who took third in state) raced against 39 other schools from 15 different states. The boys raced as a tight team (led by Peter Armstrong who finished eighth in the state), proving age doesn't matter when you have determination. The girls took the course next led by eighth grader Anna Scholtens who took fourth place and earned All-American honors (she also set a new school record for girls' cross country at the state meet). This was truly a historic season for Coach Brooks and the entire team.

WINTER SPORTS PREVIEW: At Grace in the winter it's all about basketball! We are excited for the great things to come for our teams this season! Our Varsity Girls (7th/8th) are starting out strong with practice this week. Their competitive season begins at a Trinity High School tournament November 15-17. Varsity Boys (7th/8th), JV Girls (5th/6th), and JV Boys (5th/6th) teams start next week. *NEW THIS YEAR* – Grace will have a fourth-grade coed team with games to start in December every Saturday (schedule coming soon). Go Vikings!!

80 YEARS OF CUB SCOUTS: Grace Lutheran Cub Scouts started their new year, which according to District records is our 80th! This is also our second year with girls in the pack! So, we are now, truly a family scouting group! So far, the year is full of experiences both old and new.
